### Board Meeting Minutes

5/21/2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 PM by President Mark Sires at the Duffield residence. In attendance were: President Mark Sires, Vice President Duffy Webb, Secretary Stephanie Clark, Treasurer Jim Herriman, Past President Bruce Docken, Member at Large Dennis Duffield and Membership Chairperson David Mitts.

### Treasurers Report

Jim Herriman presented the Treasurer's report. The checking account balance is \$3,897.64 and the savings balance is \$3018.10. The web site hosting bill, domain fee and virus protection fee have been paid. The fee has been paid to the Greenway for this year's car show. The insurance bill needs to be paid immediately; David Mitts gave the invoice to Jim. The bank statement has been coming to David Mitts address. Jim shared that the statement can't be sent to the PO Box address for the club due to bank policy. He also shared that the signors on the account are Jim Herriman, Bruce Docken, and Craig Schenk. The debit card requested by Jim was mailed to David's address and he gave it to Jim at the meeting.

A budget discussion followed. Income from sponsorships is coming in, five have been received. Car show pre-registrations are coming in along with some membership dues. Opal Duffield emptied the PO Box and provided the contents to the board members prior to the meeting. Membership dues will be receipted in and a copy of the receipt will accompany the funds to the treasurer, the original receipt will remain in the receipt book and the third copy will be given to the member paying the dues. Dave will keep a listing of membership dues paid and unpaid and Jim will maintain a copy for his records and for audit purposes. After some discussion it was decided to end the prorating of membership dues outlined in the by-laws due the accounting nightmare it creates. Membership fees will be due in October for the next calendar year. Eligibility for attending the Christmas party will be based on the current year's membership.

## **General Meeting**

Mark shared Danielle, the web site designer will be retiring. She has recommended moving the site to a program called WordPress which is much easier to update. Mark will ask at the next meeting if a member is familiar with updating web sites and interested in performing this task for the club. The club will address the issue again in the spring.

David Mitts shared that Murray at YV Tech is posting the scholarship requirements, he has requested an update on progress and will report this at the general meeting.

Duffy stated Delish catering has been finalized catering for the December 14, 2024 Christmas party. The invoice for this does not have to be paid until right before the party. This will allow the club to get an accurate count of members attending.

The Zillah Community Days parade and pot luck at Jim Harriman's on May 11<sup>th</sup> was a great success. It was well attended and the club won a first-place ribbon for the car club category. The weather was great and everyone had a good time

The Selah Community Days parade was also well attended; we won the first-place trophy for the car club category. We were able to provide ten of the eleven requested convertible cars with help from PNWMC. Two of the junior princesses rode together in one car. Dave will bring the trophy to the general meeting next week.

At the general meeting next week Bruce Docken will report on the Cruise In event held May 14<sup>th</sup> at Major's on Lincoln Avenue.

Duffy Web attended the American Reflections car show in Moxee last weekend. He will report on this at the general meeting next week.

The PNWMC spring car show is May 26<sup>th</sup> at Columbia Park. At the Selah parade PNWMC members specifically asked that we attend their show. The clubs would both like to strengthen the relationship and support each other.

Statuses of items for the Ponies in the Sun car show were discussed. Sponsorships are coming in Dave Mitts recorded them and gave the funds to Jim Herriman. David Mitts is working on getting the appreciation plaque for the Randy, the MC for the past several years. Dave shared that he has the graphic for the shirts and will use the same vendor as last year. Bruce Docken has the wooden plaques and is working on staining them. Bruce shared that he has several food vendors for the show lined up. The Greenway staff collected our 2023 show banners and they will need to be updated with the date of the 2024 show. The listing of volunteers for the show was reviewed; Mark Sires expressed his concern that

New member applications have been received from Karen Chance who was in attendance. She shared that she has owned three Mustangs, she currently owns a 2006 GT which has been modified. She is acquainted with David and Marci Mitts and had been following the club's activities on the web site. Another applicant introduced himself as DJ, he heard of the club at the Old Steel car show. He owns a 1999 purple and green Mustang.

Three new members were officially admitted to the club at the last board meeting. They are Kim Heilman, Cody Grenz, and Charlie Adams. They have attended the required two meetings or events this year. Cody, Kim and their children were in attendance.

Mark Sires thanked the club for the get-well card and gift card sent after the three surgeries he recently had performed. Doug Heilman had leg surgery Monday; Marci Mitts is passing around a get-well card for members to sign and will enclose a gift card when she sends it to Doug.

Jokes and trivia were shared by Mark Sires.

### **Old Business**

The May 21, 2024 board meeting minutes were e-mailed to members last week. All topics will be discussed at this meeting.

Jim Herriman provided the Treasurers report. There is \$3,078.99 in the checking account. All major bills for the current year have been paid. There is \$3,018.10 in the savings account and there is a pending deposit to be made. Jim advised the signors on the account are himself, Bruce Docken and Craig Schenk. There are no planned changes at this point. The engraved plaques for the car show trophies is one of the last big expenses pending for the year. David Mitts shared that the scholarship to YV Auto Tech is pending. The Director is waiting for the end of the school year.

Duffy provided an update on the Christmas party. The Sun Country Estates activity center will be the location of the party on December 14, 2024. The caterer is confirmed and payment isn't due until the day of the event which will allow an accurate count to be provided.

Rich Leendertsen attended the Sunnyside car show on April 20. He reported there were 297 cars at the show a new record. He also attended the Old Steel car show on April 28. There were more than 320 cars at the show. He shared the organizers separated the pre-registered cars and gave them preferential parking spots.

DJ shared that he attended the West Valley High School car show on May 4. There were not many cars at this show which may have been due to poor weather conditions.

Mark Sires reported that the club won first place in the car club division at the Zillah Community Days parade on May 11. He displayed the ribbon and shared that SCMC beat the Corvette Club at this event. There was a good turnout with 18 club cars in attendance. Jim Herriman hosted a BBQ after the parade which was well attended and really fun. He brought items left at the BBQ, see him if you are missing Tupperware or utensils.

Bruce Docken reported on the cruise in at Major's drive in on Lincoln Avenue held on April 14. There was a good turnout, folks enjoyed sitting in the lawn area.

Craig Schenk attended the May 17 Selah Show and Shine at the Selah Middle School. There were lots of Mustangs; the best truck award went to a cement mixer.

David Mitts reported on the Selah parade held on May 18. There was a spectacular turnout; five convertibles from the PNWMC helped drive the royalty and VIP's in the parade. The club took first place in the car club division; Mark Sires showed the club members the trophy.

Craig Schenk attended the Mid Columbia Mopars show on May 18. His Hemi Barracuda took first place.

Duffy Webb reported on the American Reflections car show held in Moxee on May 19. It was a good venue with great cars.

On May 25<sup>th</sup> the PNW Mustang Club sponsored a Pony Trail event between Benton City and Prosser. Bruce reported that it was successful and the slowest he had ever driven on these roads! That evening there was a Jimmy Buffet tribute band playing at Clover Island, it was fun to mix with parrot heads. On May 26 the 42<sup>nd</sup> annual PNWMC Spring Car show was held at the Columbia Park. It was well attended by club members; Bruce took a first-place trophy. Building a connection between these two clubs is a long-term goal.

### **On-Going Business**

Craig Schenk and Bruce Docken provided an update on Ponies in the Sun car show items.

- Craig is updating the volunteer spreadsheet; new members are signing up. He will pass it around at the next meeting. See him to volunteer; it takes a lot of volunteer effort to put on the show.



- David Mitts has sponsor forms; members are encouraged to bring in sponsors. He has received five so far. The club accepts any dollar amount or items for the raffle or door prizes.
- David will order the plaque to recognize the car show MC Randy when he orders the trophy plaques.
- David reported that the shirts for the show are in process, the same vendor will be used.
- Bruce has signed up two additional food vendors for the show, one for caramel corn and another for snow cones.
- David reported that the Greenway staff has our banners which need to be taken to Noel for updating. Velda Welch shared she has one of the banners which advertises the show in Selah.
- Craig has met with members of the Ford Ranchero club who have been invited to this year's show. They expect 20 to 30 Rancheros at our show and will be participating in the Saturday events. They requested a change to the car show classifications which has been addressed by the board. The revised registration form has been modified and posted on the web site.

### **New Business**

On Saturday June 29 Manny Imperial is hosting his third annual car show in Wapato. There were over 100 cars last year and it is all under cover out of the hot sun. The Shelby Mustang club attends the show; Manny is a member of this club as well as ours. Great food is available, last year roast pig was on the menu. Registration is at 10:00 AM for the Farm Car Show located at Lateral A and West Wapato Road.

Rob Lions has invited the club to attend a spaghetti feed at the Tampico church on July 13 at noon to honor his daughter and club member Shelby Lions. On July 27 a memorial service will be held at the Wiley Union Church at 10:00 AM. There will be a special parking area for Shelby's Mustang, club members are encouraged to drive their cars and park in this designated area as a respectful goodbye to Shelby.

Mark Sires discussed the pro-rating of membership dues as outlined in the club by-laws. Pro-rating dues created an accounting nightmare and the board would like to eliminate this process. Rich Leendertsen made a motion to remove pro-rating of membership dues from the by-laws, Mark Clark seconded the motion, the motion passed unanimously. The by-laws will be modified to reflect this change.

Mark shared the club web site designer will be retiring next year. She has recommended the site be moved from HTML to a new program called WordPress. It is easier for an inexperienced person to make changes. This transition will take place in February or March of 2025. Mark asked if there was a member willing to take on this task. There were no volunteers; we have until next year to find someone to maintain it. Currently it costs the club about \$800 per year to maintain the site.

Upcoming events are listed on the web site. The SCMC has been invited to participate in the Toppenish parade on July 6<sup>th</sup>. The organizers may want club convertibles for the royalty to ride in during the parade. Historically not a lot of our members have participated and there was not a lot of interest since this is a holiday weekend. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

There will be a cruise in at the Peppermint Stick drive in on June 11 at 6:00 PM. Bruce Docken shared there was a poor turnout at the last event at this site and they are one of our sponsors. It would be nice to have a better showing.

Craig Schenk said the Selah Hot Rods on First Street show has been real quiet this year. He had no information to share.

On June 20<sup>th</sup> Children's Wishes and Dreams will hold their annual fund raiser at VanArnam winery. Velda Welch shared the charitable contributions to the community this organization makes. The cost is \$50 which covers food and a beverage. There will be live music, a silent auction and a live auction.

On a weekend following the Ponies in the Sun car show Duffield's will host a BBQ at their home. The date has not been set.

A fabricator in Glead will be holding a run the weekend after our show in September. Specific information was not available.

David Mitts has SCMC business cards to hand out at events to encourage new members. See him to get a supply of cards. Membership has been growing.

The 50/50 raffle was won by Craig Schenk for an amount of \$21. Dianna Hanmer won the door prize, a gift card to Round Table.
