Board Meeting Minutes

4/17/2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM by President Mark Sires at the Duffield residence. In attendance were: President Mark Sires, Vice President Duffy Webb, Secretary Stephanie Clark, Past President Bruce Docken, Member at Large Dennis Duffield and Membership Chairperson David Mitts.

Saturday's Mustang birthday celebration at Reno's on the Runway was a great success. Twelve cars from the PNWMC of the Tri-Cities attended and a total of sixty-five cars were on site. The public relations work done by Brian Teegarden, Craig Schenk, and Bruce Docken contributed to the success of this event and is greatly appreciated by the club. Three membership applications were received at the event. Mark will call these prospective members to invite them to the general meeting next week and explain attending this meeting would qualify as attending their second club activity qualifying them for membership approval by the Board.

Cars, Chrome and Coffee on Saturday mornings had over 100 cars at their first official gathering this year. SCMC members have not attended the past couple of weeks.

Treasurers Report

Mark Sires presented the Treasurers report for Jim who was unable to attend. The checking account balance is \$4,930.78 and the savings balance is \$3018.05. There was no report regarding if the web site bill has been paid or if the fee has been paid to the Greenway for this year's car show. Mark shared that he has been made aware that Danielle, the web site designer will be retiring in a couple of years. She has been really good at keeping the site updated. A new web consultant will be needed.

David Mitts shared that Murray at YV Tech is posting the scholarship requirements; he will report this at the general meeting.

Mark Sires shared that he will be unavailable for meetings in May for medical reasons. Vice President Duffy Webb will run the meetings; Mark agreed to create the agendas for the May meetings.

General Meeting

Mark reserved the Round Table meeting room for the 11-19-24 meeting.

Duffy stated he contacted Lisa at Delish catering and finalized catering for the December 14, 2024 Christmas party. The invoice for this does not have to be paid until right before the party.

Rob Lions honorary membership was approved at the last general meeting. Mark spoke to Rob this week and confirmed the SCMC is invited to Shelby's memorial service on July 27. More information will be shared closer to the date.

The club will provide the burgers, hot dogs and buns with the members bringing salads, side dishes and desserts. After the meeting an e-mail will be sent to members with all the details.

The Selah Community Days parade was discussed. Mark and Velda Welch may not be able to provide convertibles for the parade VIP's. Velda is experiencing mechanical difficulties with her car and Mark will not be available. It appears we will be able to provide the eleven requested cars because PNWMC agreed to attend and provide four or five cars. David Mitts will coordinate this event; he has already provided the necessary insurance information.

A Cruise In event is planned for May 14th at Major's on Lincoln Avenue at 6:00 PM. Fried asparagus will be on the menu.

The PNWMC spring car show is May 26th at Columbia Park. Mark shared that he has been in communication with their President several times and they attended the Mustang birthday gathering as well as agreeing to provide cars for the Selah parade. It would be nice to build on this relationship and members attending their car show would help strengthen this relationship.

Thanks for reaching out. Yes, because of its importance to our community we are taking on the car show this year. Preregistering is recommended, though registration will still be available the day off.

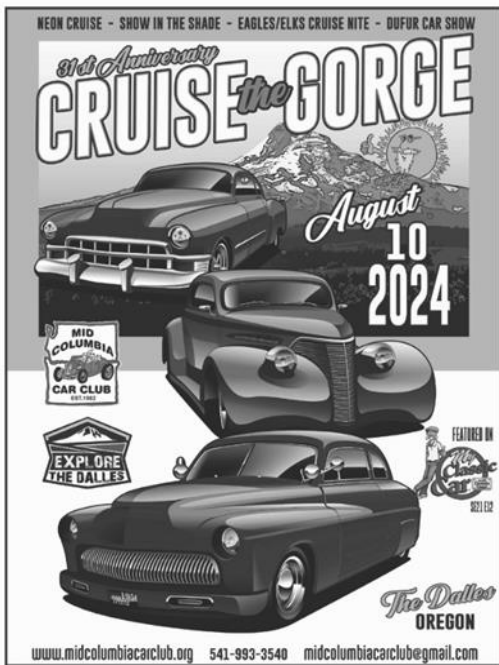

4/23/2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Vice President Duffy Webb. He asked members to sign in for entry into the door prize drawing and if possible to wear a name tag. Members who want a name tag need to let Dave Mitts the Membership Chairperson know. 50/50 tickets are for sale by the meeting sign in sheet. Craig Schenk shared that Mark Sires surgery went well and he is home recovering. He hopes to be able to at the May club meetings.

A membership list is being passed around the meeting for members to check if their information is correct. If changes need to be made, they can be written on the listing and updates will be made by David Mitts.

The Mustang 60th birthday party at Reno's on the Runway was a great success. It was well attended by club members. Twelve cars from the PNWMC of the Tri-Cities attended and a total of sixty five cars were on site. The public relations work done by Brian Teegarden, Craig Schenk, and Bruce Docken contributed to the success of this event and is greatly appreciated by the club. New membership applications were received at the event from Charlie Adams, Cody Grenz and Kim Heilman. They were in attendance at the meeting and introduced themselves sharing information on the Mustangs they own. They have now attended two meetings or events and are eligible for membership which will be voted on at the next Board and General meetings.

Craig Schenk attended the Cars Chrome and Coffee event on Saturday from 7:00 to 9:00 AM at 37th Avenue and Tieton Drive. This weekly event runs all spring, summer, and into the fall. Last week there were more than 100 cars of all types in attendance.

Craig also attended the Sunnyside car show on April 20th. There were more than 300 cars of every make and model. Craig's Barracuda won the Best Muscle Car category. Craig said it's always a fun show with about a dozen classifications. Four other club members attended.

The Treasurer's report was presented; there is \$4,930.78 in the checking account and \$3,018.05 in the savings account.

Velda Welch had SCMC merchandise for sale. There are a few of last year's car show shirts left over they are \$20, men's size small, 2X and 3X are available. Hats are \$7 and only a few are left.

The status of Ponies in the Sun car show was reported by Bruce Docken and Craig Schenk who met earlier this week. Craig created a list of last year's jobs and volunteers who performed them. He passed it around at the meeting asking members to consider signing up for the same task or some other job they are interested in performing. Members who were not involved are encouraged to participate. It takes a lot of effort to host this event and all volunteers are appreciated. If you are interested and don't know what you can do, sign up and Craig will contact you to find a good spot for your skills. Trophies are being worked on, sponsor sheets are being turned in and a food vendor has been secured for the show on September 15, 2024. Last year the Ford Falcon car club was invited to attend, one Falcon attended the show. This year the Ford Ranchero club, which is a state wide club, is having an event in Yakima on Saturday September 14th. Their club has been invited to attend our car show on Sunday; two specific car classes have been added in anticipation of Rancheros attending.

Vice President, Duffy Webb secured a caterer for the Christmas party. Lisa Duffield who owns Delish catering will provide London broil, chicken fettuccini, roasted potatoes, vegetables, salad and her famous bacon. The clubhouse on Gun Club Road has been secured for December 14, 2024.

The Round Table meeting room has been confirmed for the November 19th meeting which was moved forward to avoid Thanksgiving week.

May 11, 2024 is the Zillah Community Days parade and pot luck BBQ at Jim Herriman place. A show of hands indicated seven members intended to participate in the parade. Members who want to drop off food at his house prior to the parade are welcome to contact him and make these arrangements. Jim was able to schedule the cars early in the parade so they can easily exit and continue to his home. The club will be providing hot dogs and hamburgers. Members bring side dishes and dessert. Members wishing to convoy to the parade can meet at 9:00 AM at I-82 exit 40, the Parker exit. Jim will be sending an e-mail to members with all the details.
